



In 1930 by the will of the late W. C. Purdie, a fourth share in his residuary estate for the purchase of scientific books for the College Library.

In 1931 by the will of the late Emily Lilias Johnston the sum of £2,000 was bequeathed to the College for the purpose of providing Scholarships to be shared equally by male and female students. The Professorial Board has drawn up regulations for the Scholarships which have been approved by the Council. It will, however, be some little time before the estate is realised and the money paid over. Till this is done no Scholarships will be awarded.

Under the will of the late Dr. Arnold Izard one half share of his residuary estate after termination of a certain life-interest is bequeathed to Victoria University College for scholarships and general purposes.

Books for the Library have been given by the late Sir James Hector, K.C.M.G., the late Sir Theo. Cooper, the late Mr. H. W. Eve, the late Mr. G. A. Hogben, the late Mr. A. P. Buller, Messrs. J. W. Joynt, R. T. Turnbull and T. W. Kirk, the late Mr. J. R. Blair, Miss Izard, Dr. Arnold Izard, Sir R. Stout, Miss Pumphrey, the Hon. F. M. B. Fisher, Mr. A. de B. Brandon, Mr. D. Coghill, Mr. A. R. Atkinson, the late Mr. W. S. Reid, Professor Hunter, Professor Garrow, Professor Sommerville, Professor Cotton, Mr. P. Levi, Sir Frederick Chapman, Mr. W. F. Hogg, and Mr. R. F. Blair.

HISTORICAL NOTICE.

On the 23rd December, 1878, a Royal Commission was appointed to inquire into and report upon the operations of the University of New Zealand and its relations to the Secondary Schools of the Colony, and upon the best means of bringing secondary and higher education within the reach of the youth of both sexes. The Commission in its report, under date 9th July, 1879, among other things, recommended that the inequality in the educational institutions of the two islands should be removed by establishing, at the most important centres of population in the North Island, Colleges capable of supplying an education of the same standard as that provided by the University of Otago and Canterbury College, and proposed that the Government should invite the Legislature to make immediate provision for the establishment of two Colleges, one at Auckland and the other at Wellington.

For the maintenance of these two Colleges the Commissioners suggested that the Government should utilise the reserves set apart for the promotion of higher education in the Provincial Districts of Auckland and Wellington, and that the two Colleges should be respectively endowed with Crown lands sufficient to provide an immediate income to each amounting to £4,000 per annum; that, if this were not practicable, the deficit in each case should be made good by a pecuniary grant.

A College was established in Auckland by "The Auckland University College Act, 1882."

Nothing was done for Wellington until the year 1894, when an Act was passed entitled "The Middle District of New Zealand University College Act, 1894," which said "There shall be established in the city of Wellington a College to be connected with the University of New Zealand"; and provision was made for a governing body, to be called the Council, but no provision was made for any pecuniary grant or endowment. Certain members of the Council were appointed, but nothing could be done for want of funds.

In the year 1897, the Right Hon, R. J. Seddon, P.C., Premier of the Colony, introduced into Parliament the Victoria College Act, an Act, as stated in the preamble, "to promote Higher Education by the establishment of a College at Wellington in commemoration of the sixtieth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria," the College being intended to embrace in its work the Provincial Districts of Wellington, Taranaki, Hawke's Bay, Nelson, Marlborough and Westland. The Act was passed on the 22nd December, 1897, the Council was formed, and the work of organisation was begun. The Act provides for the payment out of the Consolidated Fund of a grant of £4,000 a year, and out of this sum the Council was required to give six scholarships each year, called "Queen's Scholarship," to persons of either sex under the age of 14 years upon the results of an examination under such conditions as the Council may prescribe. In 1903 an amending Act was passed providing for six Junior and four Senior Queen's Scholarships. In 1906 the College was relieved of the payment of these Scholarships. By the Education Act Amendment Act, 1907, the Queen's Scholarships were abolished. The Act of 1897 further set apart a parcel of land 4,000 acres in extent in the Nukumaru Survey

District (Wellington Provincial District) as an en-

dowment for the College.

The Council decided to begin by the appointment of four Professors for the Chairs of Classics, English Language and Literature, Chemistry and Physics, and Mathematics and Mathematical Physics, and the following were appointed:—Classics, J. R. Brown, M.A., St. Andrews and Oxford; English Language and Literature, H. Mackenzie, M.A., St. Andrews; Chemistry and Physics, T. H. Easterfield, M.A., Cambridge, Ph.D., Würzburg; Mathematics, R. C. Maclaurin, M.A., LL.D., Cambridge. These Professors arrived in the Colony at the end of March, 1899, and as soon as possible classes were organised and lectures begun.

The Staff has since been increased by the foundation of Chairs in Modern Languages, Biology, Roman Law, etc., English and New Zealand Law, Mental and Moral Philosophy, Physics, Education, Economics, History, Geology and Agriculture.

Upon the foundation of the Massey College in 1927 the chair of Agriculture was discontinued.

The College was admitted as an institution affiliated to the University of New Zealand on the 23rd February, 1899.

SITE AND BUILDINGS.

In 1900 an Act was passed whereby the College Council was empowered to acquire a site for the College buildings, being part of a town reserve situated on Salamanca Road, six acres in extent, and the Government provided £31,000 towards the cost of buildings. A portion of the buildings was erected, the foundation stone being laid by His Excellency Lord Plunket, K.C.V.O., on the 27th August, 1904. They were opened by His Excellency Lord Plunket on the 30th March, 1906.

In March, 1910, a further portion of the buildings was completed, forming a wing at the rear of

the Arts Building. This wing contains two large class-rooms, and in the basement a men's cloak room, and common rooms for students.

In 1919, the Government made the College a grant for the north wing. This wing provides accommodation for the Library and the School of Economics, a Women's Common Room and a Tea Room.

The library contains a handsome stained glass window erected in memory of the students who fell in the War, 1914-1918.

In 1921 the Government made a further grant for the erection of the South Wing. This wing provided accommodation for the Physics and Geology Departments and freed additional space for Chemistry and Biology in the old Science Wing.

In 1905, the College received from Parliament an additional annual grant of £2,000 for specialisation in Law and Science.

In 1914, the Victoria College Amendment Act was passed, by which it was enacted that the name of the College should in future be the Victoria University College. Changes were made in the constitution of the Council and of the Professorial Board. In the same year by an amendment to the New Zealand University Act an increase of £3,000 was made in the annual grant, and all the grants from the Government were consolidated into one annual grant of £9,000; further, the College was allotted a share of the National Endowment grant, part of which (amounting in 1930 to £2,250) comes direct from the Government, while a second part (amounting in 1930 to £1,124) is paid through the New Zealand University. Of this last sum £300 is set apart for Workers' Educational Classes.

In 1923, a short amending Act was passed which gave the Council power to levy its own Class fees without the previous approval of the Governor-in-

Council. It also provided for a change in the date of the end of the Financial Year from March 31st to December 31st, and for a change in the date of the Annual Meeting of the Council from the May Meeting to the July Meeting.

In 1919, an amending Act to the New Zealand University Act was passed, in which it was enacted that from April 1st, 1920, the annual grant to this College should be increased by £2,500.

In 1915, the Trustees of the late T. G. Macarthy made a grant of £10,000, for the purpose of establishing a School of Economics, to be called "The T. G. Macarthy School of Economics." The foundation of the Chair was, however, delayed owing to the war. The Chair was founded in 1920 by the appointment of Professor B. E. Murphy.

In the same year, under the will of the late Sarah Anne Rhodes, the sum of £10,000 was left to the Council for the education of women.

In 1921 the Council arranged with the S. A. Rhodes Trustees to grant either a Sarah Anne Rhodes Fellowship, or a Sarah Anne Rhodes Scholarship, and alternative sets of regulations were drawn up. The first scholarship was awarded in 1921 to Miss Eleanor A. Pope, B.Sc.

The first Fellowship was awarded to Miss E. A. Pope in 1925.

In 1930 the regulations were altered with the approval of the surviving trustees to provide for the appointment of a Travelling Fellow and/or a Lecturing Fellow. The first Travelling Fellowship was awarded to Miss Violet A. M. Macmillan, B.H.Sc., in 1931.

In 1932 Miss Violet Macmillan, B.H.Sc., was appointed Lecturing Fellow and has taken up residence at Palmerston North, her office being at Massey College.

In 1923 Sir Walter Buchanan made a donation of £10,000 to found a Chair of Agriculture. The Chair was filled by the appointment of Professor G. S.

Peren, B.S.A., Toronto.

Upon the establishment of the Massey Agricultural College in 1927 the Victoria University College Council agreed to hand over the income derived from the Buchanan Trust funds to that College, and Professor G. S. Peren resigned his Chair having been appointed Principal of the Massey College.

In 1926, by the will of the late W. Weir, a sum estimated at £60,000 was left to the College to provide

and maintain a hostel for men students.

In 1931 the destruction caused by the Hawke's Bay earthquake and the refusal of the Government to pay over the subsidy due under the bequest caused substantial alterations in the plans for the Weir House. After the earthquake the then Minister of Education (the Hon. Mr. Atmore) refused to approve the erection of a brick hostel, with the result that the Council decided upon ferro-concrete. When it was ascertained that the Government could not at present pay the statutory subsidy it was found impossible to continue with the erection of the building as at first designed. The work on the dining hall block was stopped and temporary dining accommodation and servants' quarters were provided in the main hostel building. The accommodation available will now be for about 85 students. The erection of the building is proceeding and it will be completed in time for the 1933 session. The House will be opened for residence on March 1st, 1933.

In 1928 by an amendment of the N.Z. University Act, the statutory grant was increased from £10,600

to £11,750.

In 1931 the statutory grant was reduced to £9,431 18s. 0d. and the special grant of £850 per annum for the Chair of Education was withdrawn.

In 1932 the statutory grant was reduced to £7,350.

COLLEGE LIBRARY.

The College Library is maintained by an annual grant of £525 out of the College funds. At present it contains about 26,200 volumes, and subscribes for rather more than 100 periodicals.

ADULT EDUCATION.

In 1915, the Council, in co-operation with the Workers' Educational Association, established three tutorial classes in Wellington. The adult education movement grew steadily and in 1932, throughout this University District, twenty-three courses of lectures were given, twenty-six Discussion Groups met, and more than forty groups were formed in connection with the Canterbury College Box Scheme. Fourteen series of Talks were broadcast from station 2YA.

In 1932 the Government withdrew the grant for W.E.A. purposes, but owing to the generosity of the Carnegie Trustees a special grant of £750 was made to the College which enabled the work to be carried on during 1932 though the number of classes had to be somewhat reduced.

It is hoped to carry on a limited programme during 1933.

Note.—Terms will be granted only in subjects mentioned above.

The College year shall consist of three Terms the First Term to begin about the first week in March and to end about May 10th; the Second Term to begin about May 15th and to end about August 15th; the Third Term to begin about September 6th and to end about the end of October.

The College examinations begin about October 10th.

MATRICIILATION.

To matriculate a student must pass the Matriculation Examination and make the following declaration:—"I do solemnly promise that I will faithfully obey the Statutes of the University, so far as they apply to me, and I hereby declare that I believe myself to have attained the age of sixteen years."

No examination passed by any student before he has made this declaration can count towards the keeping of terms or the qualifying for a Degree.

The last day for making the Declaration is June 1st, provided that upon payment of a late-fee of £1 1s. 0d. the declaration may be made not later than August 1st.

SUPERVISION OF COURSES.

The Professorial Board supervises the courses of all new students. Before enrolment in classes a record of the proposed course of study, signed by the Chairman of the Professorial Board, or by the Dean of one of the Faculties of Arts, Science, Commerce, or Law), must be in the hands of the Registrar. In the case of a student proceeding to one of the University degrees, this record shall state the complete course of study proposed for that degree; and subsequent departures (if any) from such proposed courses must be similarly recorded.

TERMS.

The subjects in which the keeping of terms is necessary are:—All subjects for B.A., B.Sc., and LL.B. Degrees, certain of the subjects for B.Com., all the subjects of the Engineering Entrance and of the Medical Intermediate.

No examination will be held nor terms granted except in subjects taught in the College (see list above).

INTERNAL STUDENTS.

To keep terms in any subject an internal student must

(a) Have his name on the books of the College:

(b) Do the Class work and Class examinations to the satisfaction of the Professor; provided that in exceptional circumstances the Professor may allow him to keep terms by passing the examination provided for external students.

For keeping Terms in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Geology or Geography, the Practical

Examination or performance of a practical course to the satisfaction of the instructor shall be deemed to be a part of the College Examination; and, unless specially exempted by the Science Faculty, a student presenting himself for an Examination in any of these subjects for the purpose of keeping Terms must do the practical work in that subject in the year in which he so presents himself.

ATTENDANCE.

To fulfil the attendance requirement in a subject a student must, except in cases approved of by the Professorial Board, attend not less than 75% of the lectures in that subject.

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION VII. OF STATUTE "BACHELOR OF SCIENCE."

Candidates shall be tested on translation of a passage written in a prescribed foreign language and dealing with the subject or subjects offered at

the Advanced stage.

Candidates are required to present themselves for examination in the first term of the second year of the Advanced course. In case of failure a candidate may submit himself for re-examination in the second term of the second year of his Advanced course.

EXTERNAL (Exempted) STUDENTS.

Exemption from lectures is provided for under certain conditions (see Calendar, N.Z. University, 1933, p. 29).

To keep terms in any subject an external student

must:-

(a) Obtain exemption from lectures and pay an exemption fee of £1 1s. not later than May 1st, except

with late fee of £1 1s. up to September 30th.

(b) Pay examination fees (£1 1s per subject) not later than July 10th, except with late fee of £1 1s. up to September 30th.

Note.—Extra-mural students are warned that an application to sit for the College Terms Examinations does not constitute an entry for the Degree Examinations. To enter for an examination for a degree section they must communicate with the Registrar of the University of New Zealand, and obtain proper printed forms, returning same with appropriate fees by the due date (for dates and fees—see N.Z. University Calendar).

(c) Pass in the subject at the Annual College Examinations.

Note.—An additional fee of £1/1/- is required from exempted students who desire to be examined in Oral French.

Note.—No candidate shall communicate direct with the examiner. Communications with regard to examinations must be made through the Registrar.

ACADEMIC YEARS.

A student may sit for a section of a degree at the end of his first year but may not sit for his final examination until he has completed at least three years work to the satisfaction of the Professorial Board.

DISCIPLINE

Every student attending lectures at Victoria University College shall be required to sign the following declaration and no student shall have his or her name placed on the College books until this declaration is signed:

"I do solemnly promise that I will faithfully obey the Regulations of Victoria University College, so far as they apply to me."

The Board has full disciplinary powers over the conduct of all students within the College, the Gymnasium, the College grounds and at all ceremonies and meetings wherever held, conducted under the auspices of the College Council, the Professorial Board, the Students' Association, or any of the College Clubs or Societies, and in other cases when the Board considers that the interests of the College or of students are affected.

Students whose work or attendance is unsatisfactory may be excluded from College Classes for the remainder of the Session by the Professorial Board.

STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION FEE.

Every student attending lectures shall each year on enrolment pay to the Registrar the sum of £1/1/-, which sum shall be paid into a Consolidated Fund in the name of the Students' Association; provided that any student in whose case payment may involve hardship may appeal to the Professorial Board for exemption or for reduction of same; provided further that the Council may direct the Registrar to withhold any sum necessary to pay for damage done in the Students' Common Rooms or Cloak Rooms.

Upon payment of this sum the student shall ipso facto become a member of the Students' Association and shall also be entitled to become on written application and without any further payment a member of all College clubs and societies provided he agrees to abide by their constitutions and rules.

Note.—Students taking only one half-course shall not be required to pay the above fee.

Students whose Students' Association fee is unpaid by the end of the First Term will be debarred from further attendance at classes.

LIBRARY REGULATIONS.

1. In the case of disorderly conduct or any breach of the regulations the Librarian may, and in serious cases shall, report the person so offending to the Chairman of the Professorial Board. Any person so reported, if found guilty of any breach of the Regulations, shall be reprimanded and may be excluded from the use of the Library or dealt with in such other way as the Professorial Board may direct.

HOURS.

- 2. During the Session the Library shall be open to readers from 9 a.m. to 9.30 p.m. with an interval of an hour at mid-day on all week days except Saturdays, when it shall be open from 9 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.
- 3. The Library shall be closed on Sundays, on public holidays, and at such other times as the Professorial Board may direct.
- 4. Regulations will be issued from time to time for the use of the Library during recess.

ADMISSION FOR READING PURPOSES.

- 5. The following persons shall be entitled to use the Library for reading purposes:—
 - (a) Members of the College Council.
 - (b) Members of the Teaching Staff.
 - (c) Students who have paid the College fee for the current year.
 - (d) Graduates of the University of New Zealand who have taken their course at Victoria University College.
 - (e) Graduates of any University, and persons engaged in Research work, and any other persons; provided that in every case permission shall have been granted by the Library Committee of the Professorial Board.

Note.—Persons using the Library under (c) must present to the Librarian a Library Card for current year, to be obtained from the Registrar. Persons using the Library under (d) and (e) must also present such a card, but may obtain this either from the Registrar or from the Chairman of the Library Committee.

CONDUCT OF READERS IN THE LIBRARY.

- 6. (a) The use of pens and ink in the Library is strictly prohibited except at tables provided for the purpose.
 - (b) Silence must be observed in the Library.
 - (c) Communications with other readers should be avoided: applications for information, etc., should be made to the Librarian.
- 7. No books are to be removed from the Library except as provided in Regulations 10, 11 and 12.
- 8. Books removed from the shelves by readers must be left on the tables in the reading rooms, except Periodicals, Dictionaries, Encyclopedias and Law reports, which shall be replaced in the shelves.
- 9. Readers are particularly cautioned against injuring books belonging to the Library by writing in the margin, marking or turning down the leaves, or otherwise disfiguring them.

BORROWING BOOKS.

- 10. Members of the College Council and the Professors and Lecturers of the College may borrow any volumes provided:
 - (a) That entry of each volume so borrowed be made, dated, and signed, by the borrower, in the Ledger provided for the purpose.

- (b) That volumes specified in Regulation 13 be retained by borrowers not longer than one week, and that no volume be retained for more than two months except during the long vacation.
- 11. Any other member of the Staff may borrow volumes except those volumes specified in Regulation 13, provided:

(a) That entry be made as in Regulation 10.

(b) That not more than 5 volumes be in his possession at one time and that no volume be retained for more than one month except during the long vacation.

12. Any other person privileged under Regulation 5 for reading purposes may on application to the Librarian borrow books at hours notified on the

Library notice-board, provided:

(a) That a deposit of One Guinea be made with the Librarian which shall be returned to the depositor when he ceases to avail himself of the privilege of borrowing books provided he has returned undamaged all books borrowed by him.

This deposit may be excused on presentation of a written recommendation from a Professor which shall be valid only for the

current year.

(b) That not more than two volumes be in his possession at one time and that no volume be retained for more than 14 days: provided that on the written request of a Professor any Honours or Research student or student doing work at Stage III. may take out five volumes at one time, no volume to be retained for more than one month.

13. Save as provided in Regulation 10, encyclopædias, dictionaries, law reports, prose translations of the classics, books containing valuable engravings,

works with loose plates or maps, periodicals which have been less than a fortnight in the Library, may not be borrowed from the Library. Provided, always without prejudice to Regulation 10, that text-books prescribed for the current year, and books listed as specially in demand, may be withheld, lent, or recalled by the Librarian. A book so recalled must be returned within three days.

14. A Request Book shall be provided in which the names of those wishing to obtain books in circulation, the titles of the books and the date of request may be entered. Any book which has been entered in the request book shall be returned in the demand of the Librarian within three days

15. The borrower shall be liable for any damage a book may have sustained whilst in his keeping.

16. No book belonging to the Library shall be privately lent by any borrower, except those specified in Regulation 10.

17. All books and publications of every kind shall be returned on or before December 14th in each year, and during the ten days immediately following the Library shall be closed; provided that members of the staff who desire to retain books in their possession during this period may do so on furnishing a list of such books to the Librarian on or before December 14th, and that members of the staff may also borrow books during the same period on application to the Librarian.

NOTE.—Reciprocal arrangements have been made with the Wellington Philosophical Society, whereby Students of the College can visit the library of that Society and consult books and periodicals, on production of a card from the College Librarian.

(b) (1) A short essay on some subject arising out of the works selected under (a) (2) An account of some period of literature and its connection with the general history of the period. In the period special attention must be paid to the authors indicated but the other authors in the period are not to be neglected. The literary movements and their leaders, the current types and forms of literature and their representatives, as well as the influence of the ancient classics and of the leading Continental literatures on the English literature of the period, must also be examined. Great importance is attached to composition. General outlines of English Litera-

ture including a knowledge and appreciation of the thought and style of standard English authors from Shakespeare to

Tennyson.

It will also cover the requirements of Advanced Economics and International Trade as defined for the B.Com. Degree. Three lectures per week, on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, 6 to 7 p.m.

ECONOMIC HISTORY.—Two classes. (a) The economic history of England from the break-up of

Two lectures per week, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 6 to 7 p.m. This class will meet the requirements of Economics II.(B), part of the work for Honours in Arts and Commerce, the B.Com. Degree, and the Diplomas in Banking and Social Science. Reading will be prescribed as required. (b) The economic history of Imperialism in the 19th and 20th centuries, with special reference to the British Empire, covering, in conjunction with class (a), the requirements of Honours in Arts and Commerce. One lecture per week, on Mondays, 5 to 6 p.m., or such other hour as may be arranged to suit the convenience of those concerned. Reading will be prescribed as required.

Course C. (Dr. Heine).

ECONOMIC GEOGRAPHY.—A general treatment, covering, but not necessarily confined to, the requirements of the B.Com. Degree and the Diploma in Banking. One lecture per week, on Fridays, 5 to 6 p.m.

Course D. (Dr. Heine).

STATISTICAL METHOD.—A general treatment, covering, but not necessarily confined to, the requirements of the B.Com. degree, the Diploma in Journalism, and (in conjunction with course E.) Honours in Arts and Commerce. One lecture per week, on Wednesdays, 6 to 7 p.m. Reading will be prescribed as required.

Course E. (Professor Murphy).

ECONOMIC METHODOLOGY.—The scope and logical method of Economics, the relation of Economics to the other sciences and to contemporary life and thought, economic fallacies, mathematical, mechanical,

historical, and biological analogies in Economics, schools of economic thought, covering (in conjunction with course D.), but not necessarily confined to, the requirements of Honours in Arts and Commerce. One lecture per week, at an hour to be arranged to suit the convenience of those concerned. It is desirable, but not essential, that students attending this class should possess some preliminary knowledge of Logic.

A—Lectures twice weekly on General Physics, Properties of Matter, Heat, Sound and Light; Monday and Wednesday 10 to 11 a.m.

B—Lectures twice weekly on General Physics, Properties of Matter, Electricity and Magnetism; Tuesday and Friday 9 to 10 a.m.

C—Practical Work.

- (a) Monday, 3 to 6 p.m., and Friday 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.; or
- (b) Monday, 7 to 10 p.m., and Wednesday, 3 to 6 p.m.

D—Acoustics for students preparing for the Mus. B. Degree.

Students are required to pass certain test examinations on theoretical Physics, to complete the prescribed course of experiments and to pass a practical examination. Students are also required to keep neat and concise, but adequate, notes of their experimental work; these will be marked every week.

C—Applied Physics. Students taking this course must either be attending or have already attended the ordinary advanced course in Physics. Times and books to be arranged.

D—Practical Work. Students must do at least 6 hours practical work per week. Times to be arranged.

BOTANY.

It is essential that students should provide themselves with text-books, and should read fully and carefully. Every student should come to lectures with some ideas, and with notes as to the difficulties that his preliminary studies have not removed. It is part of the duty of the teachers to help him with these difficulties.

In both lectures and laboratory work due regard will be had to the University syllabus, but work will not be confined to the syllabus.

Text-Books.—It is obligatory to have Parker's Lessons in Elementary Biology or Dendy's Evolutionary Biology; Johnson's Note Book for Practical Botany, or Bower and Vaughan's Practical Botany for Beginners; and one of the following:—Strasburger's Text Book of Botany (3rd or later English edition); Miss A. F. M. Johnson's Text Book of Botany; Mudge and Maslen's Class Book of Botany; or Bower's Botany of the Living Plant. It is very desirable that students should have Cockayne's New Zealand Plants and their Story.

Instruments—All students must provide themselves with the following instruments at least, a razor for section-cutting, a pair of mounted needles and a pair of forceps with fine points. It is very desirable that every student should have a pocket lens. Students that have not Johnson's Note Book must have a laboratory drawing-book, with alternate pages ruled for notes.

ADVANCED AND HONOURS CLASSES—There will generally be two lectures a week and at least one discussions class a week. It is necessary that students attending these classes should have at least Strasburger's Botany and Dendy's Evolutionary Biology. Raber's Principles of Plant Physiology is of great value.

ZOOLOGY.

It is essential that students should provide themselves with text-books, and should read fully

and carefully. Every student should come to lecture with some ideas, and with notes as to the difficulties that his preliminary studies have not removed. It is part of the duty of the teachers to help him with these difficulties.

In both lectures and laboratory work due regard will be had to the University syllabus, but work will not be confined to the syllabus.

Text Books.—It is obligatory to have Thomson, Outlines of Zoology, or Borradaille, Manual of Elementary Zoology, Marshall and Hurst's Practical Zoology and Marshall's Frog. It is highly desirable that every student should have also Dendy's Evolutionary Biology.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Scholarship shall be open to students, whether graduates or undergraduates, who have pursued successfully a Science course of an advanced standard and who have not completed their fourth academic year on 1st October of the year in which the Scholarship is awarded.
- 2. The subjects of examination shall comprise not less than two nor more than three of those prescribed for the B.Sc. course, and at least one of such shall be taken at the advanced grade.
- 3. The Scholarship shall be awarded by the Professorial Board on the basis of the College examinations in conjunction with the practical work done by the candidates throughout their course.
- 4. The Scholar must attend a course of lectures and do practical work to the approval of the Professorial Board.
- 5. The Scholarship shall not be tenable with any other scholarship or exhibition.
- 6. The Scholarship is of the value of £50, tenable for one year.
- 7. Scholars shall receive payment in two equal instalments, the first about August 1st, and the second when the conditions of the Scholarship have

been fulfilled. Payments shall be subject to a favourable report on the work of the Scholar by the Dean of the Science Faculty.

8. Candidates must apply in writing to the Registrar not later than the 20th of September.

JACOB JOSEPH SCHOLARSHIPS.

The late Mr. Jacob Joseph bequeathed a sum of £3,000 to Victoria University College, in the year 1905, for the foundation of Scholarships. On this foundation two or more Scholarships, tenable for one year, are open for award annually. The Scholarships are of the value of £60, but the Council may, in its discretion and on the recommendation of the Professorial Board, increase the value of any Scholarship to £120 for the purpose of encouraging full-time research at Victoria University College.

1. The Scholarships shall be open to students (either men or women):—

(i.) Whose year of matriculation is not more than five years prior to the year of the award—except in the case of Law students, for whom the corresponding interval shall be seven years:

(ii.) Who have studied at Victoria University College for at least two years, and have completed an honours course thereat to the satisfaction of the Professorial Board.

- (iii.) Who have been certified by the University of New Zealand to have attained to the standard of Honours.
- 2. Preference, ceteris paribus, shall be shown to students of Law and Experimental Science (including Mental and Moral Philosophy, provided that evidence of sufficient Laboratory work be forthcoming.)
- 3. The Scholarships shall be awarded on evidence of capacity to undertake original work.
- 4. The tenure of the Scholarships shall be subject to the following conditions:—
 - (i.) (a) A scholar who has been awarded a Scholarship of the value of £60 shall undertake original work on a subject of investigation to be approved by the Professorial Board, and shall, during the year of tenure, carry on that work to the satisfaction of the Board.
 - (b) A Scholar who has been awarded a Scholarship of the value of £120 shall comply with all the conditions set forth in 4 (i.) (a) and shall devote his full time to the pursuit of his investigation as directed by the Professorial Board.
 - (ii.) Every scholar shall submit to the Professorial Board a thesis, or other prescribed written record of his work for the Scholarship; and shall state generally in the preface to that thesis, and specificially in notes, the main source from which his information is derived, and the extent to which he has availed himself of the work of others. He shall supply a copy of this thesis for the College Library.

- (iii.) The thesis to be typewritten in quarto size, on one side of the paper with ample spacing and margins, and bound, with the author's name and title of thesis on the cover.
- 5. (i.) A Scholar who has been awarded a Scholar-ship of the value of £60 shall receive payment in two equal instalments, the first on August 1st, and the second when the conditions of the Scholarship have been fulfilled. Both payments shall be subject to favourable report on the work of the Scholar by the Professorial Board, but the second instalment shall not be paid unless the conditions have been fulfilled within fifteen months of the award.
- (ii.) A Scholar who has been awarded a Scholar-ship of the value of £120 shall receive payment in such instalments as the Council on the recommendation of the Professorial Board shall determine, provided that the final instalment shall not be paid before the Scholar has satisfactorily completed his thesis or other prescribed written record of his work, and provided further that such thesis or other prescribed written record shall be completed within fifteen months of the award of the Scholarship.
- 6. Applications, in which a statement may be made as to the nature of the original work proposed, shall be sent in to the Registrar by May 1st.
- 7. The holding of another scholarship shall not debar a student from holding a Jacob Joseph Scholarship.
- 8. In the event of no scholarship or only one scholarship being awarded in any year, additional scholarships may be awarded in any subsequent year.

NATIONAL RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIPS.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the National Research Scholarship Regulations, 1927.
- 2. (1.) Not more than four National Research Scholarships may be awarded in any year in accordance with section 12 of the said Act and with these regulations.
- (2.) Such scholarships shall be awarded only to graduates of the New Zealand University and to other suitable persons approved for the purpose by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (hereinafter referred to as the Council).
- 3. (1.) Application for the award of a National Research Scholarship shall be made to the Council by writing addressed to the Permanent Secretary of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research, at Wellington, not later in any year than the 14th day of February: Provided that the Council may, in its discretion and in special cases, receive any application after the said date in any year, and may award to the applicant a scholarship for that year.
- (2.) Every application for a scholarship under these regulations shall specify with reasonable particularity the nature of the investigation or research proposed to be undertaken by the applicant in the event of a scholarship being awarded him.

- (3.) Every application shall be supported by one or more certificates signed by a Professor of the University of New Zealand or some other suitable person, to the effect that in the option of the person by whom such certificate is given, the applicant is a fit and proper person to undertake the proposed investigation or research and to be holder of a scholarship under these regulations.
- 4. (1.) Every scholarship granted under these regulations shall be of the value of £180 per annum, to be paid by equal quarterly instalments.
- (2.) In addition to the aforesaid amount, not more than £25 in the aggregate may be paid to the holder of a scholarship for the purchase of books or apparatus specially required for the purpose of carrying out any investigation or research, and towards the cost of locomotion while engaged thereon.
- (3.) All books or apparatus purchased as aforesaid shall be and remain the property of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research.
- 5. (1.) Every scholarship granted under these regulations shall be tenable for one year, but may be withdrawn at any time if the Council is satisfied that the holder has failed to comply with the terms and conditions on which the same has been awarded.
- (2.) Without limiting the number of new scholarships that may be awarded in any year, the term of any scholarship may, with the approval of the Minister, be extended for not more than one year.
- 6. (1.) The work of investigation or research in connection with a scholarship granted under these regulations shall be carried out at a University college or other institution or place approved for the purpose by the Council, and in accordance with such conditions as the Council may impose.

(2.) Except in special cases and with the consent of the Council the holder of a scholarship shall not engage in any work or occupation not associated with the investigation or research for the purposes of which

the scholarship was granted.

7. The holder of the scholarship shall be required to furnish to the Council a quarterly report as to the progress of his investigation or research. Such report shall be accompanied by a certificate from a Professor of the University or other approved person to the effect that the holder of the scholarship has worked to his satisfaction and in conformity with the terms of the scholarship.

8. (1.) The holder of a scholarship shall not be entitled to claim payment of the final instalment of the value of the scholarship unless and until he has furnished a detailed report in a form suitable for publication of the results of his investigation or

research.

(2.) The bolder of the scholarship shall not publish or furnish for publication any report as to the nature, progress, or results of his investigation or research except with the consent of the Council.

SARAH ANNE RHODES FELLOWSHIPS.

[The funds for the purposes are derived from a bequest by Mrs. Sarah Anne Rhodes.]

REGULATIONS FOR SARAH ANNE RHODES TRAVELLING FELLOWSHIP.

1. One "Sarah Anne Rhodes Travelling Fellow-ship" may be offered by the Council of the Victoria University College.

- 2. The Fellowship shall be open to women students of the University of New Zealand or of any other university approved by the Council of Victoria University College. Every candidate must be the holder of a degree in Home Science or Home Arts or of a diploma deemed by the Council to be its equivalent. Candidates must have had previous successful experience both as students and as teachers in the sciences and arts relating to the home, and must be not less than 25 years of age.
- 3. The Fellowship shall be of the value of £500 per annum and shall be tenable for one year. The emolument shall be made available to the Fellow in instalments of which the first shall be payable when the course of investigation and the arrangements for pursuing it have been approved by the Council, and further instalments shall be paid at the end of each quarter or otherwise as may be agreed upon by the Council and the Fellow.
- 4. The Fellow shall undertake investigation in countries where in the opinion of the Council such investigation may be most profitable; the investigation shall be into the methods adopted to promote the knowledge and practice of the home sciences and arts among the women of the countries visited.
- 5. During the course of her investigation the Fellow shall forward to the Council quarterly interim reports on her work and shall at the close present a complete report in a form suitable for publication.
- 6. The Fellow shall undertake to return to New Zealand on the termination of her Fellowship, and if requested so to do by the Council shall deliver within six months of her arrival in New Zealand a short course not exceeding eight lectures in all at one or more of the University Colleges in New Zealand, the expenses incidental to such lectures to be defrayed by the Council.

- 7. The Council of Victoria University College may terminate a Fellowship if the Fellow is guilty of misconduct or of neglect of the duties of the Fellowship.
- 8. A Fellow is required to devote herself wholly to the objects of the Fellowship and is forbidden during its tenancy to hold any position of emolument, except by the permission of the Victoria University College Council.
- 9. The date of application for a Fellowship shall be advertised by the Council of Victoria University College.

REGULATIONS FOR SARAH ANNE RHODES LECTURING FELLOWSHIPS.

- 1. One or more "Sarah Anne Rhodes Lecturing Fellowships" may be offered by the Council of Victoria University College.
- 2. The Fellowship shall be open to women students of the University of New Zealand or of any other university or institution of university rank approved by the Council of Victoria University College. A candidate must be the holder of a degree in Home Science or Home Arts or of a diploma deemed by the Council to be its equivalent and must produce evidence of being a successful teacher of wide experience in the sciences and arts relating to the home. A candidate must be not less than 25 years of age.
- 3. The Fellowship shall be of the value of £500 per annum payable calendar monthly together with transport and other expenses approved by the Council, and shall be tenable in the first instance for one year, the engagement to be renewable annually at the option of the Council.

- 4. The Fellow will be required to give a course or courses of lectures and demonstrations in the Victoria University College District on subjects that will promote among the women of New Zealand a sound knowledge and practice of the home sciences and arts. Such courses shall occupy not less than 30 nor more than 40 weeks annually as may be arranged by the Council. The syllabus of the course shall be submitted to the Council for approval in a form suitable for printing and distribution not less than two months before the commencement of the course.
- 5. The Council of Victoria University College may terminate a Fellowship if the Fellow is guilty of misconduct or of neglect of the duties of the Fellowship.
- 6. The Fellow is required to devote herself wholly to the objects of the Fellowship and is forbidden during its tenancy to hold any position of emolument, except by the permission of the Victoria University College Council.
- 7. The date of application for a Fellowship shall be advertised by the Council of Victoria University College.

THE LISSIE RATHBONE SCHOLARSHIPS.

(The Lissie Rathbone Scholarships were established in 1925 by the Trustees of her will, she having bequeathed one half of her residuary estate for such Charitable, Educational or Religious objects as the Trustees should select. The Trustees have allotted £3,000 to Victoria University College, the income from which is to be applied to Scholarships.)

In pursuance of powers vested in the Council by the Trustees the following regulations are prescribed to govern the award and tenure of the Scholarships in this University College:

- 1. There shall be offered in each year one or more Lissie Rathbone Scholarships, as the funds will admit.
- 2. Election to the Scholarship shall be made by the Council of the Victoria University College.
- 3. The annual value of each Scholarship shall be not less than £50.
- 4. The tenure of each Scholarship shall be for three years, terminable however at any time if the Council, having received from the Professorial Board an unfavourable report of the conduct or progress of the scholar, shall so determine.
 - 5. Candidates for each Scholarship
 - (i.) Must be under nineteen years of age on the first day of December immediately preceding the date of the award of the Scholarship.
 - (ii.) May be of either sex.
 - (iii.) Must have been resident in the Victoria University College District for one year on the first day of December in the year in which they enter.

Note.—"Residence" for the purpose of this clause applies to the candidate's home and does not apply to the school he is attending.

- (iv.) Must state their willingness to pursue as internal students of Victoria University College a course for a degree within the award of the New Zealand University from time to time (subject to such regulations as may be consistent with the object of the Scholarship) which may be selected by such scholar, his parents or guardians.
- 6. Each Scholarship shall be awarded upon examination for excellence in the subjects of English and History. Provided that the Council shall not be bound to award the Scholarship to the candidate

obtaining the highest number of marks in such subjects, but may in its discretion take into account the financial circumstances of the scholar, his parents or guardians.

7. The examination in which the award shall be made shall be the examination presented by the University of New Zealand for the award of its Entrance Scholarships, the examination papers used being those set in English and History for that examination. If, however, there shall at any time cease to be an Entrance Scholarship examination, or if there shall cease to be examination papers set in either English or History for the Entrance Scholarships, the examination in which such award shall be made shall be such other examination in English and History as the Council may from time to time appoint.

8. This Scholarship shall not be tenable with a "University Entrance Scholarship. No candidate shall be awarded a Scholarship whose aggregate marks do not reach 50 per cent. of the possible total.

9. Candidates for the Lissie Rathbone Scholarships need not be candidates for an Entrance

Scholarship to the University.

10. In the event of the accumulated earnings of the gift being in excess of the amount required for scholarships awarded under Clause I., the Council may either grant boarding allowance to any scholar needing it, or make a grant to any student, who, though he or she has not qualified in the Entrance Examination in the subjects prescribed for the Scholarship, has obtained at the College examinations of his first year a high class in the two subjects, English and History. In the event of the accumulated earnings of the gift proving at any time insufficient for all or any of the purposes above set forth the Council may adjust the annual value of any scholarship or the tenure thereof as the Council shall see fit from time to time.

11. Every candidate for the Scholarship shall send notice of his or her candidature on the prescribed form not later than 1st October. Entries shall be made in duplicate, one copy, accompanied by entry fee 10/6, to be sent to the Registrar of the University of New Zealand, and the other copy to the Registrar, Victoria University College; provided that, if the candidate is also a candidate for a University Entrance Scholarship, the entry fee of 10/6 is not required.

NOTE: Late entry allowed up to 22nd October on receipt of late fee of £2 2s.

Forms of entry may be obtained on application to the Registrar, Victoria University College.

12. Payments shall be made in four equal instalments, which shall be payable towards the end of March, the end of May, the end of July, and the end of September. Payments shall be subject to the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

13. In cases approved by the Council scholars may be permitted to transfer to another University College.

JAMES MACINTOSH SCHOLARSHIP REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Scholarships to be awarded pursuant to these regulations shall be known as the "James Macintosh Scholarships."
- 2. The term "the Trustee" wherever used in these regulations shall mean the trustee or trustees for the time being of the estate of the late James Macintosh.

- 3. The Scholarship shall be of two kinds, namely:—
 - (a) Local Scholarships, and
 - (b) Travelling Scholarships.
- 4. The said Scholarships will be awarded on the recommendation of a Committee hereinafter referred to as "the Advisory Committee" consisting of the Chairman of the Professorial Board of Victoria University College, the Dean of the Faculty of Arts, and the Professor of Education in the said College, provided that, if the Professor of Education in any year happens to be the Chairman of the Professorial Board or Dean of the Faculty of Arts, the last Chairman of the Professorial Board or Dean of the Faculty of Arts (as the case may be) shall be a member of the Advisory Committee.
- 5. Local Scholarships shall be tenable for one year and shall be of the value of one hundred pounds (£100). The purpose of the award of such Scholarships shall be to assist graduate students in the pursuit of an Honours course at Victoria University College.
- 6. Travelling Scholarships shall be tenable for two years and shall be of an annual value of two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) provided that the Trustee may in his discretion in special circumstances and on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee extend the tenure for a further period not exceeding one year. The purpose of the award of such Scholarships shall be to assist students who have completed the undermentioned course in Education to proceed with post-graduate and/or research work at an approved University or other institution in Great Britain, Europe, or America.
- 7. Applicants for a Travelling Scholarship (in addition to the other qualifications hereinafter provided) must be a graduate of the University of New

Zealand and have completed at Victoria University College and to the satisfaction of the Advisory Committee a course in the subjects set out in the syllabus for Education in the Statute "Master of Arts and Honours in Arts."

- 8. One or more Scholarships of either kind may be awarded each year as the Trustee of the fund for the time being may in his discretion think fit having regard both to the moneys from time to time available and also to the number and qualifications of applicants for such Scholarships. If no suitable persons apply for either of such Scholarships in any year then no scholarships shall be awarded in that year.
- 9. Applicants for both kinds of Scholarships shall be male students who (i.) have attended lectures at Victoria University College for a period of at least two years prior to making application; (ii.) have not, and whose parents and guardians have not, the necessary means to enable such applicants to pursue further academic studies without the financial assistance provided by such Scholarships; (iii.) are loyal subjects of the British Empire and will undertake to use the knowledge acquired by them as the result of the award of such Scholarship for the well-being of their fellow citizens and to use their best endeavours at all times to maintain the British Empire intact and to assist in promoting the happiness and prosperity of the people of such Empire; (iv.) intend to adopt the profession of teaching.
- 10. Each applicant for a Scholarship shall apply in writing addressed to the Registrar of Victoria University College before the fifteenth (15th) day of October and in such application shall set out full particulars of his qualifications as required by paragraphs (7) and (9) hereof. Applicants for Travelling Scholarships shall in addition set out particulars of the course of study and/or research proposed to be followed by such applicant together with the name

of the University or other institution to be attended by the applicant in the event of a Scholarship being awarded to him.

11. Each applicant shall also forward together with his application an undertaking signed by him in the following form:—

"I being an applicant for a James Macintosh Scholarship hereby undertake that if such Scholarship be awarded to me I will as far as possible use and apply the knowledge acquired by me as the result of award of such Scholarship for the well-being of my fellow citizens of the British Empire and that I will at all times do my best to assist in maintaining that Empire intact and in promoting the happiness and prosperity of the people thereof."

Signed.....

12. The Advisory Committee will as soon as practicable after the 15th day of October consider all applications received and will thereupon recommend to the Trustee whether any candidate or candidates should be awarded Scholarships of either kind. If more than one candidate be so recommended for any one kind of Scholarship, the said Committee shall set out in its recommendation the names of such candidates in order of merit. In its deliberation the Advisory Committee shall first take into consideration the applications for Travelling Scholarships and make its recommendation thereon before proceeding to deal with applications for Local Scholarships.

13. The amount of the Scholarships will be paid in equal quarterly payments in advance provided that in the case of holders of Travelling Scholarships the last quarterly payments shall be withheld until the satisfactory completion of the course of study and/or research.

- 14. The holder of a Scholarship shall devote the whole of his time to the pursuit of the purposes for which the Scholarship is granted and wherever practicable shall (unless for special reasons excused by the Trustee from so doing) reside in an approved hostel or hall of residence affiliated to the University or institution wherein he is pursuing his studies and/or research.
- 15. The Trustee may at any time refuse to make further payments to the holder of any Scholarship if such holder ceases to possess the necessary qualifications for an applicant for such Scholarship or if the Advisory Committee at any time reports to the Trustee that such holder is not pursuing his course of study and/or research to the satisfaction of such Committee.

COLONIAL APPOINTMENTS SCHEME.

RECRUITMENT OF UNIVERSITY GRADUATES.

(For the information of Applicants.)

Arrangements have recently been made between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and in New Zealand for facilitating recruitment for the British Colonial Services from the New Zealand University.

The scheme enables New Zealand University graduates to be considered on equal terms with candidates from Great Britain and the other self-governing Dominions for certain posts in the administrative, medical, agricultural, veterinary, police, and other services in a number of British Crown Colonies and Protectorates which are under the control of His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

Applicants accepted for service in Tropical Africa will receive one year's training at Oxford or Cambridge with an allowance of £233 to meet all expenses. Applicants accepted for special services—e.g., Medical, Forestry, Audit, and Survey—are required to go through similar courses, with allowances from £225 to £275 per year. THE VICTORIA COLLEGE ACT, 1905.

[As amended by the Education Act Amendment Act, 1907, the Queen's Scholarship Act, 1906, the Victoria College Act Amendment Act, 1914, and the Victoria College Amendment Act, 1923.]

An Act to consolidate certain Enactments of the General Assembly relating to Victoria College.

[27th October, 1905.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The short Title of this Act is "The Victoria College Act, 1905."

THE COLLEGE.

2. There is hereby established in the City of Wellington a college connected with the New Zealand University, to be called "the Victoria College."

THE CORPORATION.

3. The Council of the College, its professors and lecturers, and the graduates and undergraduates of the New Zealand University, whose names are on the books, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate under the style of "the Victoria University College," by which style that corporation shall have perpetual succession and a common seal.

THE COUNCIL.

- 4. The corporation shall act by a governing body, to be called "the Victoria University College Council" (elsewhere throughout this Act referred to as "the Council.")
 - 5. The Council shall be constituted as follows:— (a) A group of two members appointed by the Governor:

(b) A group of two members appointed by the Professorial Board of the College:

Provided that-

(c) A group of four members elected by the District Court of Convocation of the Victoria University District as defined by the New Zealand University Act, 1908:

(d) One member appointed by the Wellington

City Council:

(e) A group of two members elected by the members of the Education Boards of education districts wholly or partly within the Victoria University District:

f) One member elected by the governing bodies of the secondary schools as defined by section eighty-nine of the Education Act, 1908, in the Victoria University District:

(g) A group of two members elected by the teachers in public schools in the Victoria University District holding certificates of competency under section fifty-four of

the Education Act, 1908:

- (h) One member elected by those teachers in secondary schools and in day technical schools, as defined respectively by section eighty-nine of the Education Act, 1908, and by section sixteen of the Education Amendment Act, 1910, in the Victoria University District who are graduates of any British chartered University, or are holders of certificates of competency under section fifty-four of the Education Act, 1908.
- 6. (1) Members appointed pursuant to paragraphs (b) and (d) of section five hereof shall be appointed by resolution passed at a meeting of the Board or Council making the appointment.

- (2) Members elected pursuant to paragraphs (c), (e), (f), (g), and (h) of the same section shall be elected in manner hereinafter appearing.
- (3) The first appointments and elections of members pursuant to the said section five shall be made within the first seven days of the month of June nineteen hundred and fifteen, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, and the members so appointed or elected shall come into office on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and fifteen:

Provided that no appointment or election shall be made under the provisions of paragraphs (a), (e), or (g) of the said section, save for the purpose of filling casual vacancies, until the month of June, nineteen hundred and seventeen.

- 7. (1) For the purpose of election of members pursuant to paragraphs (c), (e), (g), and (h) of section five hereof the following provisions shall apply:-
 - (a) The Registrar of Victoria University College, or such other person as the Council appoints, shall be the Returning Officer who shall conduct all elections of those members.
 - (b) The Returning Officer shall prepare separate rolls of the persons who are entitled to vote for a member or members pursuant to the said paragraphs (c), (e), (g), and (h), and shall enter in the respective rolls the name, occupation, and address of every person who possesses the necessary qualifications entitling him to vote; provided that no person shall be entered on more rolls than one.
 - (c) Any person who possesses more qualifications than one shall be entitled to

have his name transferred from one roll to another roll on which he is qualified to be enrolled at any time before the closing of the rolls as hereinafter mentioned:

Provided that a person who has had his name so transferred from one roll to another roll shall not be entitled to have his name transferred from the lastmentioned roll until after two years have elapsed since the date of the transfer to that roll, unless he has ceased to be qualified to have his name thereon.

- (d) All rolls shall be closed at five o'clock in the afternoon of the fourteenth day immediately preceding the day on which an election is to be held and shall continue to be closed until the election is completed; and no name shall be entered on any roll while that roll is closed.
- (e) Claims for enrolment shall be made and disposed of in accordance with regulations made by the Council.
- (f) At every election the votes shall be given by sealed voting-papers, in the form prescribed by regulations made by the Council, delivered to the Returning Officer personally on or before the day fixed for the election, or forwarded to him by post or otherwise so as to reach him not later than that day.
- (2) For the purpose of the election of a member pursuant to paragraph (f) of section five hereof the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (a) The governing body of each secondary school shall be entitled to one vote for every hundred or part of a hundred

pupils (exclusive of the pupils in any lower department) in average attendance for the year ending on the thirty-first day of December immediately preceding the election.

- (b) The votes of each such governing body shall be by resolution passed at a meeting of that governing body.
- (3) In any election to which this section refers the majority of votes shall decide the election, provided that if two candidates have an equal number of votes the Registrar shall (if necessary) determine the election by lot in the presence of the Chairman or other member of the Council.
- 8. (1) No member of the Professorial Board or of the teaching staff of the College consequential shall be a member of the Council unless he is appointed a member by that Board pursuant to paragraph (b) of section five hereof.
- (2) A member of the Professorial Board so elected shall not be entitled to vote on any question before the Council affecting himself or directly affecting the salary of any member of the teaching staff of the College, or directly affecting any payment made by or due from the Council to any member of the teaching staff.
- 9. Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding section, the term of office of all members appointed or elected as provided by paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (e), and (g), of section five hereof shall be four years, and of all other members shall be two years; but all members shall continue to hold office until the appointment or election of their successors
- 10. On the first day of July, nineteen hundred and fifteen, of the members appointed under the provisions of the principal Act by the Governor in Council, the one who has been longest in office shall

retire, and the other two members so appointed shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Governor under this Act; in like manner, of the members elected under the principal Act by the graduates of the New Zealand University on the books of the College, the one who has been longest in office shall retire, and the other two members shall be deemed to have been elected in accordance with paragraph (c) of section five of this Act; in like manner, of the members elected under paragraph (d) of sub-section one of section five of the principal Act, the one who has been longest in office shall retire, and the other two members shall be deemed to have been elected in accordance with paragraph (a) of section five of this Act; and, in like manner, of the members elected under the provisions of the principal Act by Education Boards, the one who has been longest in office shall retire, and the other two members shall be deemed to have been elected in accordance with paragraph (e) of section five of this Act; and the member elected by the Professorial Board shall retire.

11. (1) Except as provided in the last preceding section, the members of the Council who are in office on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and fifteen, shall continue to hold office, subject as hereinafter in this section mentioned.

(2) On the first day of July, nineteen hundred and seventeen, and on the same day in each second year thereafter, one-half of the members mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (e) and (g) of section five hereof and the members mentioned in paragraphs (d), (f), and (h), of the said section shall retire from office.

(3) The members to retire from each of the groups mentioned in paragraphs (a), (c), (e), and (g) of section five hereof on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and seventeen, shall be those who have been longest in office.

- (4) The member to retire from the group mentioned in paragraph (b) of the said section five on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and seventeen, shall, on or before the first day of May in that year, be decided by lot amongst the members of that group.
- (5) Of the members elected under paragraph (b) of section five of the principal Act, the one who has been longest in office shall retire on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and fifteen; and the remaining members shall retire on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and seventeen; and in no case shall any election be made hereafter of members under the said paragraph.
 - 12. (1) If any member of the Council—
 - (a) Dies, or by writing addressed to the Council resigns his seat; or
 - (b) Becomes a bankrupt; or
 - (c) For a period of three consecutive months fails to attend any meeting of the Council without obtaining leave or absence; or
 - (d) Is absent from New Zealand for a period of six consecutive months without obtaining leave or absence,—

he shall cease to be a member, and the vacancy thereby created shall be deemed a casual vacancy.

- (2) The member filling a casual vacancy shall hold office only for the residue of the term of the vacating member.
- 13. (1) Whenever a vacancy, whether casual or otherwise, occurs that is to be filled by appointment by the Governor it shall be the duty of the Council to forthwith report the fact to the Minister of Education.
- (2) Whenever a vacancy, whether casual or otherwise, occurs that is to be filled by appoint-

ment by the Professorial Board, or by the Education Board, or by the Wellington City Council, it shall be the duty of the Council forthwith to report the fact to the Board or Council which appointed the vacating member.

- (3) Whenever a vacancy, whether casual or otherwise, occurs that is to be filled by election it shall be the duty of the Council to do all things necessary for the proper conduct of that election.
- (4) Each vacancy, whether casual or otherwise, shall be filled by the same authority as that which appointed or elected the vacating member.
- 13a. [Section 12 of the Act of 1914.] (1) The appointment or election of a member to fill a vacancy caused by the expiry of the term of office of a vacating member shall be made within the first seven days of the month of June next preceding such expiry, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, but shall not take effect until such expiry.
- (2) The appointment or election of a member to fill a casual vacancy shall be made not later than thirty days after the vacancy occurs.
- (3) Every retiring member shall be eligible for reappointment or re-election.
- (4) If any vacancy is not filled within sixty days after the same occurs, the Governor shall forthwith fill the vacancy by appointing some fit person as a member in place of the vacating member.
- 14. The Council shall meet at least once a month at such time and place as the Council determines.
- 15. At its first meeting held in the month of July in each year the Council shall elect one of its members to be Chairman.
- 16. The Chairman shall hold office for one year and shall be eligible for re-election.

17. Special meetings may be called at any time by the Chairman or any two members, five days' previous notice of the place and time for such meeting being posted or telegraphed to all the members.

18. At all meetings of the Council—

- (a) The quorum shall be six;
- (b) All questions shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting;
- (c) The Chairman shall preside and have a deliberate vote, and, in the event of equality of voting, a casting vote;
- (d) In the absence of the Chairman from any meeting the members present shall elect one of their number to act as chairman at that meeting, and while so acting he shall have all the powers of the Chairman.
- 19. Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Council may from time to time make by-laws for the purpose of regulating its own procedure, the conduct of all elections under this Act, and the general administration of the affairs of the College:

Provided that such by-laws shall not come into operation until and unless they have been approved by the Governor-in-Council.

- 20. The Council may continue to act notwith-standing any vacancy in its body.
- 21. The Council shall cause exact minutes of an its proceedings to be kept and also full and accurate accounts of all its receipts, disbursements, liabilities and engagements.
- 22. The seal of the Council shall be in the custody of the Chairman, and shall not be affixed to any document except pursuant to a resolution of the Council.

- 23 (1) The Council shall have full power to appoint and remove all professors, lecturers, examiners, officers, and servants of the College, and to generally manage the affairs thereof:
- (2) All persons appointed by the Council and holding office on the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been appointed under this Act.

THE PROFESSORIAL BOARD.

- 24. There shall be a Professorial Board of the College, consisting of all the professors of the College for the time being, and of such lecturers of the College for the time being as the Council may from time to time declare to be members of the Board.
- 25. The Board shall have power to make rules as to the time and place of its meetings and the procedure thereat:

Provided that all such rules shall, before coming into operation, be submitted to and approved by the Council.

- 26. At its annual meeting the Board shall elect one of its members, being a professor, to be Chairman, and if it fails so to do the Council may appoint a professor to be Chairman for the year.
- 27. The Chairman shall hold office for one year and be eligible for re-election.
 - 28. At all meetings of the Board-
 - (a) A quorum shall be such number as the Board with the consent of the Council from time to time determines.
 - (b) The Chairman shall preside, and shall cause exact minutes of the proceedings to be kept.

- (c) He shall have a deliberate vote, and, in the case of equality of voting, a casting-vote:
- (d) In his absence from any meeting the members present shall elect another professor to act as chairman of that meeting, and while so acting he shall have all the powers of the Chairman.
- 29. Subject in each instance to the approval of the Council, and to such modifications as the Council thinks fit to make therein, the Board may—
 - (a) Fix the course of study, and the days and hours of lectures:
 - (b) Make rules as to the attendance of the students.
 - (c) Prescribe the subjects for examinations for scholarships, exhibitions, prizes, and other college distinctions and awards.
- 30. Subject to the right of appeal to the Council (whose decision shall be final) by any person who feels aggrieved, the Board may—
 - (a) Deal with all questions relating to the discipline of the students:
 - (b) Manage the College library:
 - (c) Give instructions to the College servants as to the performance of their duties.
- 31. The Board shall be subject to the control of the Council, and shall furnish to it such reports and information as from time to time the Council requests or the Board deems necessary.
- 32. The Board may from time to time offer such suggestions for the consideration of the Council as the Board thinks advisable in the interests of the College.

LECTURE FEES.

33. There shall be payable by the students such reasonable fees for general tuition and for attendance on lectures as from time to time the Council prescribes.

(Clauses 35 and 36 repealed by the Education Act Amendment Act, 1907.

APPROPRIATION AND ENDOWMENT.

37. For the purpose of providing a fund for the maintenance of the College, and the payment of all expenses incurred by the Council in administering the affairs thereof, the Colonial Treasurer, without further appropriation than this Act, shall, out of the Consolidated Fund, pay to the Council each year ending the thirty-first day of March the sum of four thousand pounds, in such instalments during the year as he thinks fit.*

38. The parcel of land described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby set apart as an endowment for the College, but shall remain vested in His Majesty.

39. The said parcel of land shall be held and administered as Crown lands under such of the leasing provisions of "The Land Act, 1892," as the Minister of Lands from time to time thinks fit; and the net rents and other proceeds derived therefrom and remaining after payment thereout of all necessary expenses attendant on the management and administration of the said land (including the expenses of survey and roading) shall, without further authority or appropriation than this Act, be paid over from time to time to the Council for the purposes of the College.

*The total income of the College from the Government before the cuts made in the grant on January 1st, 1922 and July 1st, 1922, was £11,500 exclusive of the National Endowment Grant.

40. The parcel of land described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be vested in the Council in trust as a site for University College buildings and as grounds appertaining thereto:

Provided that the said land shall be inalienable

by sale, mortgage, lease, or otherwise.

41. The Council may grant leases of any land (other than the land described in the First and Second Schedules hereto) to which the corporation of the College at any time becomes entitled by way of purchase, grant, or otherwise, but may not without the previous consent of the Governor-in-Council sell or mortgage the same.

ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT.

- 42. The Audit Office shall be the auditor of the Council, and shall have the same duties and powers in respect of the moneys and accounts of the Council, and of persons dealing therewith, as if the Council were a local authority within the meaning of section six of "The Public Revenues Act, 1892."
- 43. Within ten days after the close of each financial year ending the thirty-first day of December, the Council shall cause to be prepared and submitted to the Audit Office a statement of accounts showing—
 - (a) The total receipts and disbursements for the year; and
 - (b) Such other particulars as the Governorin-Council from time to time prescribes by regulations under this Act.
- 44. Such statement shall be audited by the Audit Office within ten days after receipt thereof, and shall, together with the certificate of the Audit Office and a general report as to the progress of the

College, be forwarded by the Council to the Minister of Education within thirty days after the close of such year, to be by him laid before Parliament if sitting, or, if not, then within ten days after the commencement of the next session thereof.

GENERAL.

- 45. The Minister of Education shall be the Visitor of the College, and shall have all the powers and functions usually possessed by Visitors.
- 46. The Governor may from time to time, by Order-in-Council gazetted, make such regulations as he deems necessary in order to give full effect to the provisions of this Act relating to Queen's Scholarships.
- 47. The enactments mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby repealed.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land situated in Blocks I. and V., Nukumaru Survey District, in the Wellington Provincial District, containing by admeasurement 4,000 acres, more or less: bounded towards the north by Blocks XIII., Momohaki Survey District, 14,500 links; towards the east by other part of Block I., Nukumaru Survey District. and by the Waitotara River, 38,600 links: towards the south-east by a Native reserve, 11,910 links; towards the south-west by a line, 3,500 links; and towards the west by Sections Nos. 13 and 11 in Block IX., and by Block IV., Wairoa Survey District, 33,073 links; be all the aforesaid linkages more or less: excepting therefrom the several roads which are included within the said area: as the same is delineated upon the plan deposited in the District Survey Office, Wellington.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

All that parcel of land in the City of Wellington, containing by admeasurement 5 acres 3 roods, more or less, being part of the Town Belt: bounded towards the east generally by Salamanca Road from Kelburne Parade to the northernmost corner of Hospital Reserve; thence by the said Hospital Reserve to a public road, 50 links wide, forming the northern boundary of the Roman Catholic Cemetery; thence by the said public road, 75 links; thence by a right line bearing south 22° 59' west, 460 links; thence towards the south generally by a right line bearing south 81° 40' west, 440 links, thence by a right line to the eastern side of Kelburne Parade; and thence towards the west by the said Kelburne Parade to Salamanca Road aforesaid.

Also all that parcel of land in the City of Wellington, containing by admeasurement 2 roods 23 perches, more or less, being Allotments Nos. 1, 2 and 3 shown on Plan No. 898 deposited in the Lands Registry Office at Wellington, and known as Hospital Reserve: bounded towards the north-east by Salamanca Road and Plantation Reserve; towards the south-east by a public road 50 links wide; and towards the south-west and north-west by the Town Belt.

W.E.A. TUTORIAL CLASS BURSARIES.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. One bursary tenable at Victoria University College shall be offered annually, or more than one if the Council so decides.
- 2. A bursary shall be awarded only to a student who has attended tutorial classes of the W.E.A. in the Victoria University College District, and who in the opinion of the Tutorial Classes Committee has shown a good record in class work.
- 3. Applicants shall apply to the Registrar before the 1st day of December, and shall state age, occupation, W.E.A. classes attended, record of class work, and the course they propose to follow.

- 4. The Professorial Board shall make a report to the Courcil on the merits of the candidates.
- 5. A bursary shall be tenable for three years, but may, on the recommendation of the Professorial Board, be extended for a further period.
- 6. In each year the course of a bursar shall be approved by the Professorial Board.
- 7. A bursary shall have an annual value of the fees of the classes in the course approved by the Professorial Board together with the College fee.
- 8. If in the opinion of the Professorial Board the attendance or work of any bursar is not satisfactory the bursary may be terminated forthwith.

WOMEN STUDENTS' HOSTEL SOCIETY (INCORPORATED).

For many years past this Society has maintained two Hostels, the one at No. 282 The Terrace, and the other at Kelburn, in which both University and Training College Students have resided. The closing of the Training College has compelled the Society to restrict itself to receiving University Students at No. 282 The Terrace, which will henceforth be known as VICTORIA HOUSE, and which will, provided that sufficient students are offering, be re-opened next year with improved accommodation.

Applications for reservation of rooms should be sent at once to the Warden, Victoria House, 282 The Terrace, who will furnish full information.

WEIR HOUSE.

Weir House has been established by a benefaction under the Will of the late Mr. William Weir. The Victoria University College Council has purchased the lease of a very fine site of approximately two acres, adjoining Kelburn Park, and with a magnificent view over the harbour and city. A handsome ferro-concrete building has been erected upon it, which will accommodate about eighty students.

The accommodation provided is of two types: (1) study bedroom for single students; (2) a bedroom, with study adjoining, to be shared between two students. It has been decided that the charge shall be 25s. per week for all rooms, students having choice of rooms from those made available in order of application. Students desirous of keeping their rooms during absence on vacation will be charged 5s. per week, with a maximum of £2.

Students wishing to apply for residence should do so to the Registrar, Victoria University College, on the proper form not later than 15th February, 1933.
